1. *These first listings describe groups and services that are aimed primarily or exclusively at the lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender populations. Some are specific to LGBT youth. In time, such agencies change or close, and others are created. If you want to know about any new groups being formed (particularly outside the Greater Vancouver area), it is probably best to contact any of the first three agencies listed here (Prideline, The Centre, and GAB), as they are most likely to be operating for many years and to maintain complete listings of groups and services around the province of BC.*

2. The listings in this second group are more general in nature. Some deal with HIV/AIDS issues, while others are focussed on other health concerns or legal matters. They are not aimed solely at LGBT persons, but all of these agencies are aware of LGBT concerns and strive to be fully inclusive.

General Help and Information Services in Your Community

In most BC communities, there are helpful Crisis Line or Distress Line services (often on a 24-hour basis) for persons in emotional crisis, physical or mental abuse situations, and at risk for suicide. Look in the "Community Services" pages of your White Pages telephone directory. In these same pages, there are usually listings for Women's Resource Centres, Sexual Assault Crisis Lines, and Human Rights Offices. Don't be afraid to call them.
