TAS is devoted to: (a) assisting in the personal development of its transgendered members, (b) promoting understanding of trans culture in all its diversity, (c) building a sense of community through contact with other organizations, and (d) removing all forms of barriers that negatively impact the transgendered community. The site offers news, events, workshops, and outreach services.
